TRIP PLANNING TOOLS

Hal Wilson

My last newsletter article began with a discovery I made on the DFW website, (I hope you all bought Warden Stamps) and this month focuses on another part of that website.

Earlier this year, the DFW hatchery group published the Annual Provisional Stocking Document, https://nrm.dfg.ca.gov/FishPlants/ listing by county the waters they plan to stock this calendar year. The exact planting dates are left indefinite, but a range of weeks is indicated as well as the last date the body of water was planted. This document even specifies the size of the fish that are to be stocked, grouping fish into five size groups from Fingerling (less than 5 inches) through Catchable (12") to Trophy (greater than 19").

With Google Earth, Recreation.gov and DFW Fishing Guide (<u>https://www.wildlife.ca.gov/Fishing/Ghide</u>), trips can be planned **tentatively** with advance knowledge of the fishing potential in the area, what camp grounds there are nearby, (reservable or first come, first served), the nearest town, etc. A sign-up sheet circulated at the meeting will allow members interested in the trip to request further info as it becomes available.

Another area on this website lists waters that are scheduled to be planted within a time frame approximately three weeks from the date of inquiry. The **tentative** plans can be **finalized** when the water you are interested in fishing is shown there. For example, I found two lakes in Lassen county (Silver, Caribou) within ten miles of each other, both to be stocked with "Catchable" size trout in the same general time period this season. I can now monitor the website to learn more accurately when the lakes will be planted, and make final "go/no go" decision and plans.

Recreation.gov shows the two NFS campgrounds in the area (Silver Bowl and Rocky Knoll) have a total of 35 campsites available on a first come, first served basis. First come, first served policy re campsites has both positive and negative impacts. Positive is that commitments (reservations) don't have to be made early in the season for a trip months in the future. Negative impact is that there is no assurance that you will get a campsite after driving hours to get to the area.

However, Google Earth provides suggestions for motel type lodging as possible back-ups. In my example I found motels an hour or so away from the lakes, in Chester and Susanville. In search mode on Google Earth enter "lodging near Silver Lake, Lassen County, Ca".

As Outings Coordinator, I hope the above information will stir interest in more TVFF members being Fishmeisters this year, and the Club will enjoy fishing more of our California waters and using our US National Forest facilities. Tell me what tentative trips you will coordinate and want to have listed in the

Barbless Hook as tentative so others can consider the possibility. TRY IT Let's find new places !!!

Spring 2017 Pyramid Lake Outing:

Last month I put out an e-mail and a sign up sheet for the spring Pyramid Lake Outing. This is a guided outing with Rob Anderson and Co. The Spring fishing is from step ladders which Rob provides and sets up on the edge of the drop off. The ladder allows you to cast further and keeps you warmer by keeping most of your body out of the water. Sounds odd, but it's a lot a fun. The ladders are set about 25 feet apart so it becomes a very social outing with good-natures banter, bragging, ribbing. The fish, two species of Lohantan Cutthroat Trout typically run from 4-8 pounds. , But there is the very real potential to hook and land a double-digit monster. See pictures from past years.



Go on line and look at some of the patterns for blue gill, brim, crappie etc.


If you have lce dub, small cactus chenille, dry fly hooks or scud hooks in size 14 and rubber legs please bring some to share.


